### **The Purpose of this website**

This is an initiative of Queensland Health to better prepare you, the new allied health professional. It is intended to assist you in familiarising yourself with Queensland Health systems, workplace conditions, contexts and expectations.

This will provide important information for all allied health professionals across the state. You should still receive clinical and site-specific orientation when you get to your workplace.



### **What is on the website?**

The website, available from Queensland Health computers and on CDrom contains information about Queensland Health as an organisation and employer. There are also links that may be useful throughout your career.

District and discipline specific information is not provided; rather information is aimed at all allied health professionals working in Queensland Health.

### **Is it compulsory for me to read it?**

The AHOT is provided as resource and is not a mandatory training requirement.

### **When should I read it?**

Disc versions of the AHOT are provided to new recruits to help answer some of the many questions you might have prior to commencement.

You will be allocated time for orientation at your workplace, during which you can access the AHOT on the website.

### **Who will check that I have covered the information?**

An induction checklist is provided to support your orientation to Queensland Health. Your
