**National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)/Data Set Specification (DSS) purpose/scope is sourced directly from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare's Metadata Online Registry (METeOR) (url <http://meteor.aihw.gov.au/content/index.phtml/itemId/344846>).**

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### **Admitted Patient Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The purpose of this National Minimum Data Set is to collect information about care provided to admitted patients in Australian hospitals.

The scope is episodes of care for admitted patients in all public and private acute and psychiatric hospitals, free standing day hospital facilities and alcohol and drug treatment centres in Australia. Hospitals operated by the Australian Defence Force, corrections authorities and in Australia's off-shore territories may also be included. Hospitals specialising in dental, ophthalmic aids and other specialised acute medical or surgical care are included.

Hospital boarders and still births are not included as they are not admitted to hospital. Posthumous organ procurement episodes are also not included.

NMDS data is sourced from the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC).

### **Admitted Patient Mental Health Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this minimum data set is restricted to admitted patients receiving care in psychiatric hospitals or in designated psychiatric units in acute hospitals. The scope does not currently include patients who may be receiving treatment for psychiatric conditions in acute hospitals who are not in psychiatric units.

NMDS data is sourced from the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC).

### **Admitted Patient Palliative Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this data set is admitted patients receiving palliative care in all public and private acute hospitals, and free standing day hospital facilities. Hospitals operated by the Australian Defence Force, correctional authorities and Australia's external territories are not currently included.

Palliative care patients are identified by the data element Hospital service-care type, code N[N].N.

NMDS data is sourced from the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC).

### **Aged Care Evaluation (ACE)**

**Purpose/scope:** To monitor the profile of all clients assessed by the Queensland Aged Care Assessment Teams within the guidelines of the Aged Care Assessment Program.

The target population includes 70+yrs Non-indigenous and 50+yrs Indigenous clients living in the community, residential aged care facilities or as a patient in a hospital requiring assessment for placement or services required to stay at home.

## **Aged Care Information Management System (ACIMS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide Queensland State Government Residential Aged Care Facilities with an integrated system to cater for its information needs coupled with financial, resident care and resource management.

The target population includes 70+yrs Non-indigenous and 50+yrs Indigenous clients living in the community, residential aged care facilities or as a patient in a hospital requiring assessment for placement or services required to stay home.

## **Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Services (ATODS) - Queensland Minimum Data Set**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect standard minimum data on all clients receiving treatment through Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Services (ATODS). Monitors treatment provided to ATODS clients.

The data set supports the management of data for the Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Services (ATODS) NMDS.

## **Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Services (ATODS) National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** This metadata set is nationally mandated for collection and reporting.

Publicly funded government and non-government agencies providing alcohol and/or drug treatment services. Including community-based ambulatory services and outpatient services.

The following services are currently not included in the coverage:

- services based in prisons and other correctional institutions;
- agencies that provide primarily accommodation or overnight stays such as 'sobering-up shelters' and 'half-way houses';
- agencies that provide services concerned primarily with health promotion;
- needle and syringe programs;
- agencies whose sole function is to provide prescribing and/or dosing of methadone; and
- acute care and psychiatric hospitals, or alcohol and drug treatment units that report to the Admitted patient care National Minimum Data Set and do not provide treatment to non-admitted patients.

Clients who are on a methadone maintenance program may be included in the collection where they also receive other types of treatment.

NMDS data is sourced from the Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Services (ATODS) - Queensland Minimum Data Set.

## **Australasian Rehabilitation Outcomes Centre (AROC) Inpatient Clinical Data Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information about the rehabilitation service, the person receiving rehabilitation, and administrative details about the period of rehabilitation care and clinical characteristics. The majority of information is collected at the beginning of an episode with some items, such as the outcome measure, accommodation and level of support collected at the completion of an episode as well.

Collection data is sourced from the Designated Rehabilitation Units Data Collection.

## **Birth Details System**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all notified and registered births in Queensland.

System data is sourced from the Birth Notifications Collection and the Birth Registrations Collection.

### **Birth Notifications Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all birth notifications in Queensland.

The collection of the data is managed in the Birth Details System.

### **Birth Registrations Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all birth registrations in Queensland.

The collection of the data is managed in the Birth Details System.

### **BreastScreen Queensland Registry (BSQR)**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide a complete screening history of each woman involved in the BreastScreen Queensland Program.

### **Child Dental Health Survey**

**Purpose/scope:** To monitor the oral health of school children from preschool to grade 10.

### **Clinical Costing System**

**Purpose/scope:** An aggregate group of software tools used to calculate the cost of patient care (previously known as Clinical Benchmarking Information System / Transition II) which enables analysis and reporting of hospital costs, revenue, casemix data and other management information at both the product line and patient levels across Queensland Health's major public hospitals.

The system supports the management of data for the National Hospital Cost Data Collection.

### **Clinical Incident Management and Reporting (PRIME CI)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect, analyse and report information on clinical (patient) incidents, both potential and actual.

### **Community Mental Health Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** This NMDS includes data about service contacts provided by specialised mental health services for patients/clients, other than those admitted to psychiatric hospitals or designated psychiatric units in acute care hospitals, and those resident in 24 hour staffed specialised residential mental health services.

NMDS data is sourced from the Consumer Integrated Mental Health Application (CIMHA) information system.

### **Computer Aided Retrieval of Karyotypes**

**Purpose/scope:** To monitor the incidence of all chromosome abnormalities diagnosed in Queensland.

### **Consumer Feedback Management and Reporting (PRIME CF)**

**Purpose/scope:** To report, investigate, and manage complaints and compliments received from consumers of health services provided by Queensland Health.

### **Consumer Integrated Mental Health Application (CIMHA)**

**Purpose/scope:** A consumer-centric clinical information system designed to support mental health clinicians in the provision of safer quality mental health services.

The system supports the management of data for the Community Mental Health Care NMDS and the National Outcomes and Casemix Collection (NOCC).

### **Death Registrations Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all deaths registered in Queensland.

The collection of the data is managed in the Deaths System.

## **Deaths System**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all registered deaths in Queensland.

System data is sourced from the Death Registrations Collection.

## **Decision Support System (DSS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To consolidate Queensland Health data suitable for Financial, Payroll, Human Resource, Pharmacy, and Pathology related information for decision support purposes.

## **Designated Rehabilitation Units Data Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect rehabilitation data for admitted patients with a rehabilitation episode of care (Care Type 21 Rehabilitation - delivered in a designated unit).

The scope covers the rehabilitation phase for adults who require treatment designed to restore impaired function, reduce disability, minimise handicap and improve quality of life after a client has acquired a condition from an illness or injury.

The collection supports the management of data for the Australasian Rehabilitation Outcomes Centre (AROC) Inpatient Clinical Data Collection.

## **Elective Surgery Waiting Times (census data) National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this minimum data set is patients on waiting lists for elective surgery (as defined in the 'Elective care waiting list episode-elective care type, code N' data element (also referred to by the short name 'Waiting list category') which are managed by public acute hospitals. This will include private patients treated in public hospitals, and may include public patients treated in private hospitals.

Hospitals may also collect information for other care (as defined in the Waiting list category data element), but this is not part of the National Minimum Data Set (NMDS) for Elective surgery waiting times.

Patients on waiting lists managed by hospitals operated by the Australian Defence Force, corrections authorities and Australia's external territories are not currently included.

Census data:

Data are collected for patients on elective surgery waiting lists who are yet to be admitted to hospital or removed for another reason. The scope is patients on elective surgery waiting lists on a census date who are 'ready for care' as defined in the Elective surgery waiting list episode-patient listing status, readiness for care code N data element.

NMDS data is sourced from the Surgical Access Team Reporting (SATr) system.

## **Elective Surgery Waiting Times (removals data) National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this minimum data set is patients removed from waiting lists for elective surgery (as defined in the Waiting list category data element) which are managed by public acute hospitals. This will include private patients treated in public hospitals, and may include public patients treated in private hospitals.

Hospitals may also collect information for other care (as defined in the Waiting list category data element), but this is not part of the National Minimum Data Set (NMDS) for elective surgery waiting times.

Patients removed from waiting lists managed by hospitals operated by the Australian Defence Force, corrections authorities and Australia's external territories are not currently included.

Removals data:

Data are collected for patients who have been removed from an elective surgery waiting list (for admission or another reason). Patients who were 'ready for care' and patients who were 'not ready for care' at the time of removal are included.

NMDS data is sourced from the Surgical Access Team Reporting (SATr) system and the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC).

### **Enterprise-wide Liaison Medication System (eLMS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To assist healthcare staff to manage and use medication related information for patients and to facilitate exchange of medication information with community health practitioners (i.e. GPs, community pharmacists).

### **Emergency Data Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect data from emergency departments to improve service delivery and management activities.

The collection supports the management of data for the Non-Admitted Patient Emergency Department Care NMDS.

Collection data is sourced from the Emergency Department Information System (EDIS).

### **Emergency Department Information System (EDIS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To capture Queensland Health Emergency Department (ED) attendance data including the progression of a patient through the ED. The system monitors patient progress, provides alerts, and records treatment details.

The system supports the management of data for the Emergency Data Collection.

### **Environmental Health Information Network (EH InfoNet)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on the management of food complaints and food samples in Queensland.

### **FERRET**

**Purpose/scope:** A Primary health care patient Information and Recall System (PIRS) for Indigenous and Rural Health Communities that supports standardised clinical practice as well as person surveillance and chronic disease management.

### **Finance and Materials Management Information System (FAMMIS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To enable the management of financial and materials transactions of Queensland Health in an accrual accounting environment.

### **Financial and Residential Activity Collection (FRAC)**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide detailed information on public hospital establishments including expenditure, revenue and staffing (FTE) levels and identify specialised service indicators for hospitals for national and state reporting.

The collection supports the management of data for the Public Hospitals Establishments NMDS.

### **Food Poisoning**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information on all faeces and vomitus samples from complainants who claim to have contracted food poisoning and the results of the analysis.

### **Health Labourforce Surveys**

**Purpose/scope:** To assist in Health Labourforce planning studies and to provide statistical information to interested bodies. It is used for National, State and regional education and workforce planning.

### **Health Service Provider Directory (QFinder)**

**Purpose/scope:** A directory of health and community services and a key electronic resource for use within the 13 HEALTH service, via the Queensland Health intranet site (QHEPS) and by the general public via the QFinder website.

### **Highly Specialised Drugs (HSD) Program Database**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect information that enables distribution of commonwealth funds to districts based on reported Highly Specialised Drugs (HSD) usage.

### **Incident Management System (IMS.Net)**

**Purpose/scope:** To record and report workplace health and safety accidents and near misses arising from work, a workplace activity or environment, that affect staff, visitors or other persons.

### **Information System for Oral Health (ISOH)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support the services delivered by public dental clinics. Information is collected on patient demographics and oral health service provision to clients and is used for the efficient administration, monitoring and evaluation of Oral Health Services in Queensland.

### **Lead Exposure (Notifiable) Notifications**

**Purpose/scope:** To improve the surveillance and management of excessive lead exposure in Queensland.

### **Medical Aids Information System (MAIS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support the statewide administration of the Medical Aids Subsidy Scheme and client and prescriber details, supplier (product) details, product details.

### **Mental Health Establishments Collection (MHEC)**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide detailed information on the range, level and cost of services available in Queensland mental health establishments.

The collection supports the management of data for the Mental Health Establishments NMDS.

### **Mental Health Establishments National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of the Mental health establishments National Minimum Data Set (MHE NMDS) is all specialised mental health services managed by, or in receipt of funds from, state or territory health authorities.

Specialised mental health services are those with a primary function to provide treatment, rehabilitation or community health support targeted towards people with a mental disorder or psychiatric disability. These activities are delivered from a service or facility that is readily identifiable as both specialised and serving a mental health care function.

The concept of a specialised mental health service is not dependent on the inclusion of the service within the state or territory mental health budget.

A service is not defined as a specialised mental health service solely because its clients include people affected by a mental illness or psychiatric disability. The definition excludes specialist drug and alcohol services for people with intellectual disabilities, except where they are established to assist people affected by a mental disorder who also have drug and alcohol related disorders or intellectual disability.

These services can be a sub-unit of a hospital even where the hospital is not a specialised mental health establishment itself (e.g. designated psychiatric units and wards, outpatient clinics etc).

The statistical units are specialised mental health services. These are the specialised mental health components of the state and territory health authorities, and of regions within states and territories; specialised mental health service organisations; service units within those organisations; and private hospital and non-government residential service units funded by specialised mental health services.

Non-government residential mental health services and specialised mental health services provided by private hospitals that receive state or territory government funding are included as service units for this NMDS.

There is a hierarchy of statistical units used within the MHE NMDS. Information is provided at each level: State/Territory; Region; Organisation; Hospital/Service unit cluster; and Service unit (Admitted patient services, Residential services and Ambulatory services). Each level has a unique set of attributes which comprise the NMDS data elements and additional supplementary information.

NMDS data is sourced from the Mental Health Establishments Collection (MHEC).

### **Microbiological Food Analysis Data**

**Purpose/scope:** A database of all food samples submitted for microbiological analysis and their results.

### **Monitoring of Drugs of Dependence (MODDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To monitor the prescribing and use of controlled drugs.

### **Monthly Activity Collection (MAC)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect summary data on admitted and non-admitted patient activity and bed availability from public acute hospitals, public residential psychiatric hospitals and public nursing homes/hostels/independent living units; and summary data on admitted patient activity from licensed private hospital facilities.

The MAC also collects summary data on residents admitted to multi purpose health services and bed availability in multi purpose health services.

The collection supports the management of data for the Outpatient Care NMDS and the Public Hospitals Establishments NMDS.

### **National Hospital Cost Data Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To produce the national public and private sector cost weights for Australian Refined Diagnosis Related Group (AR-DRG) reporting.

Collection data is sourced from the Clinical Costing System.

### **National Outcomes and Casemix Collection (NOCC)**

**Purpose/scope:** A national collection to support the regular review of treatment outcomes of specialised mental health services provided to persons with serious mental health problems and mental disorders which involves the routine collection of a nationally agreed 'outcomes and casemix' dataset.

Collection data is sourced from the Consumer Integrated Mental Health Application (CIMHA) information system.

### **Newborn Bloodspot Screening Program**

**Purpose/scope:** To maintain the results of newborn screening tests which involves the detection of markers in blood for a set of 30 rare conditions.

### **Non-Admitted Patient Data Set Specification (DSS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this Data Set Specification (DSS)(Phase 1) is outpatient clinic service events involving non-admitted patients at public hospitals classified as either principal referral, and specialist women's and children's hospitals or large hospitals (Peer Group A or B) as reported in the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare's Australian Hospital Statistics publication of 2008-09.

The Non-admitted patient (NAP) DSS is intended to capture instances of service provision from the point of view of the patient.

For the purpose of this DSS, an outpatient clinic is a specialty unit or organisational arrangement under which a hospital provides outpatient clinic services. The nature of the service provided by the clinic is classified by 'clinic type'. All outpatient clinic types are included in the DSS, except specialised mental health and alcohol and other drug treatment services which are included in separate NMDSs noted below.

The scope includes:

- All arrangements made to deliver outpatient clinic service events (not covered by the NMDSs listed below) to non-admitted patients:
  - whose treatment has been funded through the hospital, regardless of the source from which the hospital derives these funds. In particular, Department of Veterans' Affairs, compensable and other patients funded through the hospital (including Medicare ineligible patients) are included; and
  - regardless of setting or mode

Excluded from scope in Phase 1 are:

- All services covered by NMDS for:
  - Admitted Patient Care,
  - Admitted Patient Mental Health Care,
  - Alcohol and Other Drug Treatment Services,
  - Community Mental Health Care,
  - Non-admitted Patient Emergency Department Care, e.g. all outpatient clinic services provided to admitted patients are excluded;
- All outpatient service events delivered by private specialist services under private practice arrangements;
- Service events funded by the hospital but delivered by another entity (including community health service, NGOs and private hospitals);
- Service events which deliver non-clinical care (activities such as home cleaning, meals on wheels, home maintenance);
- Diagnostic imaging, pathology, pharmacy and other ancillary services whether they are associated with an outpatient clinic service event or provided independently of an outpatient clinic service event.

DSS data is sourced from the Outpatient Data Collection (ODC).

## **Non-Admitted Patient Emergency Department Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** This metadata set is nationally mandated for collection and reporting.

The scope of this National Minimum Data Set (NMDS) is non-admitted patients registered for care in emergency departments in selected public hospitals that are classified as either Peer Group A or B in the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare's Australian Hospital Statistics publication from the preceding financial year.

The care provided to patients in emergency departments is, in most instances, recognised as being provided to 'non-admitted' patients. Patients being treated in emergency departments may subsequently become 'admitted'. The care provided to non-admitted patients who are treated in the emergency department prior to being admitted is included in this NMDS.

Care provided to patients who are being treated in an emergency department site as an admitted patient (e.g. in an observation unit, short-stay unit, 'emergency department ward' or awaiting a bed in an admitted patient ward of the hospital) are excluded from the emergency department care NMDS since the recording of the care provided to these patients is part of the scope of the Admitted patient care NMDS.

NMDS data is sourced from the Emergency Data Collection.

## **Notifiable Conditions System (NOCS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect statewide data for all notifiable conditions to monitor disease rates and identify outbreaks to inform disease response.

## **Outpatient Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this National Minimum Data Set (NMDS) is for services provided to non-admitted, non-emergency department, patients registered for care by specialist outpatient clinics of public hospitals that are classified as either principal referral and specialist women's and children's hospitals and large hospitals (Peer Group A or B) as reported in the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare's Australian Hospital Statistics publication from the preceding financial year.

Hospitals use the term 'clinic' to describe various arrangements under which they deliver specialist outpatient services to non-admitted non-emergency department patients. Outpatient clinic services should be interpreted as encompassing services provided through specific organisational units staffed to administer and provide a certain range of outpatient care:

- in defined locations;
- at regular or irregular times; and
- where one or more specialist providers deliver care to booked patients.

Generally, in such clinics, a booking system is administered and patient records are maintained to document patient attendances and care provided.

The scope includes all arrangements made to deliver specialist care to non-admitted, non-emergency department patients whose treatment has been funded through the hospital, regardless of the source from which the hospital derives these funds. In particular, Department of Veterans' Affairs, compensable and other patients funded through the hospital (including Medicare ineligible patients) are included.

For the purposes of the Outpatient care NMDS, outreach services are counted at the specialist clinic where the patient is booked. Outreach services involve travel by the service provider, or services provided by a service provider via ICT (including but not limited to telephone and telehealth consultations). Such services may also be provided in the home, place of work or other non-hospital site.

Within the scope as defined, and subject to specific counting rules, occasions of service to be counted include outreach clinic services, services delivered in a multidisciplinary mode. A separate count of services delivered in group sessions is also collected.

Excluded from scope are:

- Outreach services which are not funded through the hospital and/or which deliver non-clinical care (activities such as home cleaning, meals on wheels, home maintenance); and
- All private specialist services delivered under private practice arrangements which are not funded through the hospital, regardless of whether or how these services may be funded by third party arrangements.
- All services covered by NMDS for:
  - Admitted Patient Care,
  - Admitted patient mental health care,
  - Alcohol and other drug treatment services,
  - Community mental health care,
  - Non-admitted patient emergency department.

Admitted patient services are excluded from scope. However, outpatient services booked for reasons independent of, or distinct from the admitted patient episode are in scope.

NMDS data is sourced from the Monthly Activity Collection (MAC).

### **Outpatient Data Collection (ODC)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect appointment, referral and demographic data on public patients receiving outpatient care.

The collection supports the management of data for the Non-Admitted Patient DSS.

### **Pathology Data Collection (AUSLAB)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect statewide public hospital pathology business critical, clinical information within Queensland Health.

### **Perinatal Data Collection aka Midwives' Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect data on all births that occur in Queensland. The collection is a basic source of information for research into obstetrics and neonatal care; to provide information on neonatal morbidity and congenital anomalies. Information assists in planning of Queensland's health services and is used for national and state reporting.

The collection supports the management of data for the Perinatal NMDS.

### **Perinatal National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this minimum data set is all births in Australia in hospitals, birth centres and the community. The data set includes information on all births, both live and stillborn, of at least 20 weeks gestation or 400 grams birth weight.

These data have two dimensions, which are the baby and the mother. All data relevant to the birth are conveyed in relation to one of these.

NMDS data is sourced from the Perinatal Data Collection.

### **Poisons Information and Licensing System (PILS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To record licences that relate to manufacturing, wholesaling and retailing practices involving scheduled drugs and poisons, and include licences for pest control operators and fumigators.

### **Pharmaceutical Usage Data Collection (PRONTO)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support the purchasing, sales & distribution for dental materials management functions of Central Pharmacy. The collection includes purchase data of pharmaceuticals and dental materials sourced by Central Pharmacy as well as financial data relating to sales of these substances to all Queensland Health Oral Health Clinics.

### **Prosecutions, Infringements and Legal Opinions (PILO)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support Environmental Health officers with prosecutions, tobacco infringement notices, and pest management, drugs and poisons investigations.

### **Public Hospitals Establishments National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** The scope of this dataset is establishment-level data for public acute and psychiatric hospitals, including hospitals operated for or by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and alcohol and drug treatment centres.

Similar data for private hospitals and free standing day hospital facilities is collected by the Australian Bureau of Statistics in the Private Health Establishments Collection.

Hospitals operated by the Australian Defence Force, corrections authorities and Australia's external territories are not currently included. Hospitals specialising in dental, ophthalmic aids and other specialised acute medical or surgical care are included.

NMDS data is sourced from the Financial and Residential Activity Collection (FRAC) and the Monthly Activity Collection (MAC).

### **Queensland Cancer Registry**

**Purpose/scope:** To describe cancer patterns in Queensland and provide information for use in studies concerning the causes, treatment and prevention of cancer. Information is used for national and state reporting.

### **Queensland Health Pharmacy Information Management System (iPharmacy)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support public hospital pharmaceutical inventory control, dispensing and distribution of medicines to patients, and management and reporting.

### **Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect demographic data and clinical information on all admitted patients from all public acute and psychiatric hospitals and licensed private hospitals and day surgery units within Queensland. Information is used for national and state reporting.

The collection supports the management of data for the Admitted Patient Care NMDS, Admitted Patient Mental Health Care NMDS, Admitted Patient Palliative Care NMDS and Elective Surgery Waiting Times (removals data) NMDS.

### **Queensland Pap Smear Register**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide a centralised repository of PAP smear results to provide a safety net, backup reminder service, collate screening history information, quality assurance information for laboratories and monitoring and evaluation of information.

### **Queensland Radiology Information System (QRIS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To register persons who have dealings with radiation sources. To record details of radiation sources used in the state.

### **Residential Mental Health Care National Minimum Data Set (NMDS)**

**Purpose/scope:** Episodes of residential care for residents in all government-funded residential mental health care services in Australia, except those residential care services that are in receipt of funding under the Aged Care Act and subject to Commonwealth reporting requirements (i.e. report to the System for the payment of Aged Residential Care (SPARC) collection).

It is proposed that NMDS data will be sourced from the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC) from 1 July 2012.

### **School Completions of Dental Treatment**

**Purpose/scope:** To record the number of completed school dental treatments, consent rates and monitor recall interval for schools.

### **Services Information Management Collection (SIMS)**

**Purpose/scope:** To support the planning and operational flow of allocated funding from State and Commonwealth budget sources, into health service organisations, primarily outside of Queensland Health. It allows financial tracking and planning from a budget allocation level, down to detailed project payments.

### **Sexual Health Information Program (SHIP)**

**Purpose/scope:** To collect data on the patients and activities of the public sexual health program.

### **Surgical Access Team Reporting (SATr)**

**Purpose/scope:** To provide a reporting system for Elective Surgery Coordinators managing waiting lists.

The collection supports the management of data for the Elective Surgery Waiting Times (census data) NMDS and the Elective Surgery Waiting Times (removals data) NMDS.

### **Tuberculosis Collection**

**Purpose/scope:** To support epidemiologic surveillance and control of tuberculosis in Queensland.

## Vaccination Information and Vaccination Administration (VIVAS)

**Purpose/scope:** To improve vaccination rates through a recall system which improves vaccine delivery to service providers and the population, and allow vaccine reconciliation to reduce wastage.
