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2. KEY ISSUES

- Sue Hope raised some concerns regarding benchmarking. She was concerned as benchmarking done previously was not executed well and it was difficult to correctly benchmark against figures or other organisations/facilities as services/facilities can vary greatly.
- Nicky Lindsay was concerned about the consultation of staff, how this information would be filtered down to staff and what information would be provided to staff in regards to how these changes will affect individuals. - Patricia Martin raised questions about the 'fee for service' as QHSSP was intended to be fee for service when it was first created and this caused a lot of disruption for staff. Helen Ceron advised that she interpreted the information as not so much a dollar for dollar fee for service rather the for this amount of money these are the services we would like provided. In addition Helen Ceron advised that there would be transition time.
