

What is a Prosthetist?

A Dental Prosthetist works independently to provide complete and partial dentures, dental appliances and mouthguards to the public. They consult directly with clients about their dental prosthetic needs and help to achieve the client's goals by cosmetically improving appearance, achieving improved breathing, nutrition and general health, or increasing confidence and social prospects with a prostheses.

What does a Prosthetist do?

Dental Prosthetists may:

- Take impressions of a client's mouth
- Construct plaster and wax models of a client's mouth and teeth
- Use the models to construct dental appliances such as mouthguards, dentures and crowns using a range of materials and techniques
- Maintain, repair and relines dentures as required
- Personally consult, advise and assist the client in all aspects of their prosthetic treatment.

Where can Prosthetists work in Queensland Health?

Queensland Health Oral Health Services offer differing work environments including clinics, hospitals and laboratories. Outreach services are also provided to hospitals, correctional centres and aged care facilities. Queensland Health encourages contemporary minimally invasive dentistry.

How do you become a Prosthetist?

After completing a relevant course in dental technology, Dental Technicians can upgrade their qualifications to become a Dental Prosthetist. Entry to the course below usually requires completion of a diploma or degree in dental technology. As entry requirements may vary, you should contact the institution for further details.

Registration

In Queensland, Prosthetists must be registered with the Dental Technicians and Dental Prosthetists Board of Queensland.
