Governance of Allied Health	<ul> <li>Enhance the clinical governance of allied health professionals:</li> <li>Directors of Allied Health positions are appointed in each Hospital and Health Service (HHS) mental health alcohol and other drug service and are included on the HHS mental health alcohol and other drug service executive;</li> <li>All allied health vacancies are reviewed and authorised for recruitment by the Mental Health Alcohol and Other Drug Director of Allied Health or Director of Allied Health in rural and remote HHSs, to ensure the appropriate skill mix is realised to best meet the service needs and</li> <li>Profession specific allied health representation is included on interview panels. This is in alignment with clause 62.1 of the Health Practitioners and Dental Officers (Queensland Health) Certified Agreement (No.2) 2016</li> <li>Implement the activities to strengthen the clinical governance for AHP in Mental Health Alcohol and Other Drug Services including Directors of Mental Health Allied Health (if they do not presently exist), in every HHS and on the Senior Mental Health and AODS Senior Management Team or Executive Management Team.</li> </ul>		AHMHAODAG HHSs MHAODB		

3. Mental health led models of care that optimise the scope of practice for all health professionals not just allied health professionals	<ul> <li>3.1 Models of care rolled out using a collaborative model with a lead/pilot sites trialling the model and then supporting services across Queensland, including rural and remote services, to implement and evaluate the models using common tools.</li> <li>Some examples of models include: <ul> <li>Early Intervention Clinics: This model offers a brief, solution focused and timely care to specific populations (e.g. suicide prevention delivered following presentation of patients to Emergency Departments) and include integration with other services following the interventions provided at the clinic.</li> <li>Ongoing implementation of new co-located and integrated models of care: Under Connecting Care to Recovery 2016-2021, co-located and integrated models such as the CCUs, Step Up Step Down, and STARR are being developed as appropriate across the state. These models provide a framework for working with the non-government sector.
