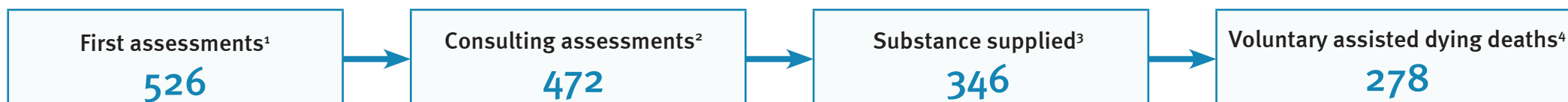
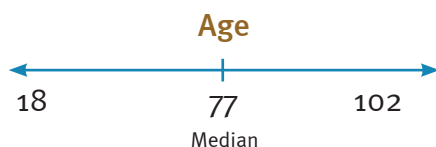

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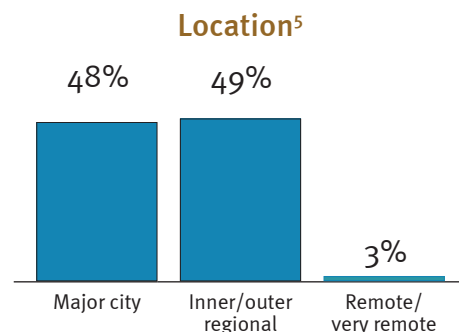


Demographics of people who received a first assessment for voluntary assisted dying (N=526)



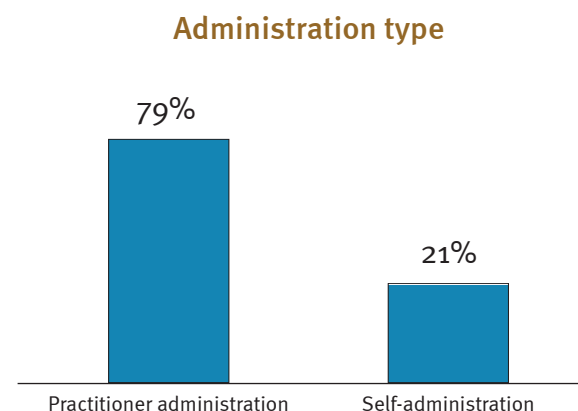

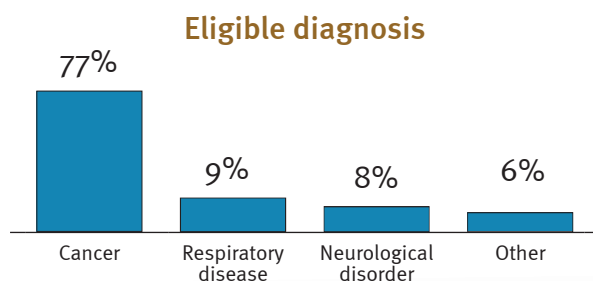

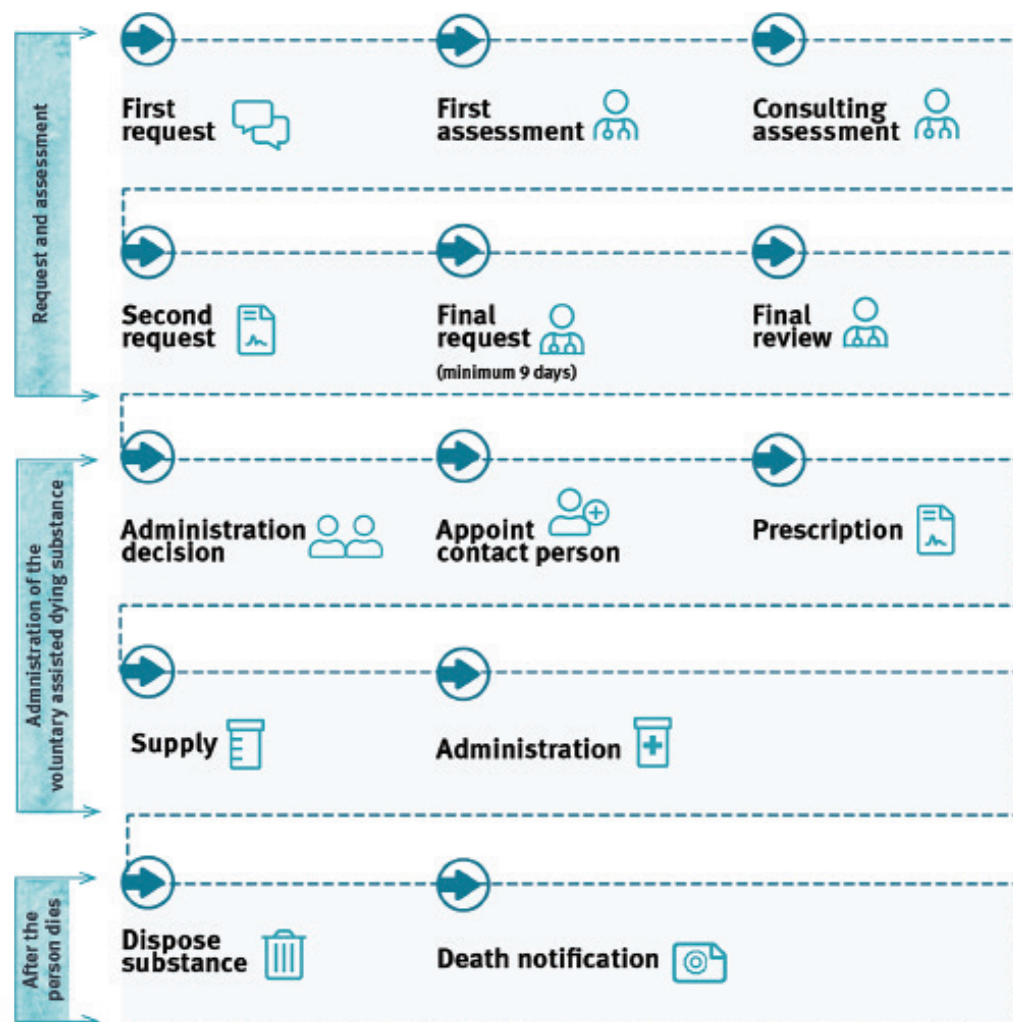

Please note that the current report is a summary of activity and demographics related to people who completed a step in the voluntary assisted dying process within the 3-month period ending 30 June 2026. Accordingly, assessments and steps may refer to requests started in a previous quarter or not completed in this quarter. Due to rounding, some proportions may add up to slightly more or less than 100%.

- 1. First assessment:** Number of people who had a first assessment completed.
- 2. Consulting assessment:** Number of people who had a consulting assessment completed. A person who has a first assessment may not go on to have a consulting assessment if they are found ineligible, withdraw from the process, or die from their underlying condition or an unrelated condition.

- 3. Substance supplied:** Number of people for whom a voluntary assisted dying substance was supplied .

- 4. Voluntary assisted dying deaths:** Number of people who have died following self-administration or practitioner administration of a voluntary assisted dying substance. This number does not include those who have started the voluntary assisted dying process and died without administration of the voluntary assisted dying substance.
- 5. Location:** Location of people who have had a first assessment. The location is categorised by the Australian Statistical Geography Standard Remoteness Structure classes of remoteness: Major Cities, Inner Regional, Outer Regional, Remote and Very Remote.

- 6. Palliative care access:** Proportion of persons who advised during a first assessment they are currently accessing or have previously accessed palliative care.
- 7. Assessed as ineligible:** Number of people who did not meet the eligibility criteria during a first assessment.

- 8. Withdrawn:** Number of people who made a first request for voluntary assisted dying, decided not to continue with the process during the request and assessment stage (i.e. before the substance is supplied) and have formally withdrawn from the process.
- 9. Authorised practitioners:** Medical practitioners, nurse practitioners and registered nurses who have been authorised by the Queensland Health Chief Medical Officer to provide voluntary assisted dying services as a coordinating, consulting or administering practitioner. Authorised practitioners must meet eligibility requirements and complete and pass the voluntary assisted dying mandatory training before being authorised.
