

6. Explanation of Tier escalation home page tile.

Hyperlink from Tier escalation homepage tile to explanation:

The Tier escalation system is designed to support hospital operations and communications and assist in the management of local capacity issues. Average duration is affected by a small number of escalations with long duration (right-tail distribution). Past frequency and duration of Tier 3 escalations is not an indicator of current or future service availability.

Tier escalations are not fully comparable between hospitals as definitions and potential responses are variable.

Tier escalation status changes frequently and is not suitable to guide consumers regarding access to healthcare. Alternative measures of service supply and demand such as presentations, occupancy, and Emergency Department performance are already reported, and should also be considered in the context of the hospital.

7. Why do I have to wait to be seen?

Text to be added to 'Specialist Outpatient' section

Your General Practitioner or Practitioner referred you to specialist outpatients as they considered that your reason for referral condition required specialist opinion beyond what is available within the primary healthcare or community setting.

Referrals are seen in order of clinical urgency. The clinical urgency of your referral is assessed using Clinical Prioritisation Criteria (CPC) where they exist for a specialty, or as per existing local referral guidelines.

CPCs are clinical decision support tools that will help ensure patients referred for public specialist outpatient services in Queensland are assessed in order of clinical urgency regardless of where they live and that patients are seen when they are ready for care.

Clinical urgency categorisation recommends a patient's clinically recommended waiting time as

Category 1 – appointment required within 30 calendar days

Category 2 – appointment required within 90 calendar days

Category 3 – appointment required within 365 calendar days.

In some specialities there are high numbers of patients waiting to be seen that may result in patients waiting longer than clinically recommended.

The Hospital Performance Website Hospital Performance ([health.qld.gov.au](https://www.health.qld.gov.au/hospital-performance)) provides quarterly information about how long 90 patients out of every 100 patients (the 90th percentile) are waiting at the facility and specialty that your referral is registered at.

Refreshed health performance site goes live with more data

- The updated Queensland Hospital Performance website is now live (as at 4 August).
- New data includes state-wide Tier 3 escalations, a hospital's response to assist in managing local capacity issues.
- Patient off stretcher times (POST) will also be broken down by month, and reported quarterly.
- The site also includes additional data on specialist outpatient performances and the number of long-stay patients occupying hospital beds
- Work has begun on a brand new Hospital Performance website

Queenslanders will have access to more health data with the launch today (**4 August**) of the new-look and easier-to-navigate Hospital Performance website.

The redesigned site comprises information and data that enables consumers to compare the performances of hospitals and health jurisdictions across the state.

It includes information about Tier 3 escalations, which are designed to help hospitals manage local capacity issues.

The site will also include a monthly breakdown of patient off stretcher times (POST), reported each quarter.

POST measures how long it takes for a patient to be transferred from an ambulance stretcher to the care of an emergency department.

The site also includes new graphs to illustrate specialist outpatient data and an interjurisdictional comparison outlining how Queensland's health system performs at a national level.

The website, launched in 2011, already publishes quarterly data on 106 health facilities across the state on areas including emergency care, elective surgery, and specialist outpatient appointments.

The site also provides information and data on staffing numbers, immunisation rates, nurse-to-patient ratios, and residential aged care summaries.

What is the purpose of the Queensland Health Performance website?

The site contains detailed, up-to-date and regular data on the activity and performance of 106 of Queensland's public health facilities.

It was launched in 2011 to provide Queenslanders with information to help them compare hospitals and help make informed choices about their healthcare.

What information does the website already include?

The site contains 120 categories of data on areas including emergency care, elective surgery, and specialist outpatient appointments.

It also provides information on oral health, BreastScreen, immunisation rates, nurse-to-patient ratios, and residential aged care summaries.

In addition to performance data, the site provides an outline of Queensland's 16 Hospital and Health Services, along with details of the facilities within each.

What has changed on the site?

Most of the data on the site is published quarterly. Why can't it be published more regularly than that?

Health data is complex. After it is provided by the state's 16 Hospital and Health Services, it undergoes a comprehensive verification process to ensure it is accurate. This takes time.

As always, Queensland Health is working on ways to provide data and information more efficiently and making it more relevant and accessible. The brand new site will strive to provide a wider range of data more regularly.

This is what I was going to chat to Rachel about. Given s.73 is asking if there is any validity to the claim that the Health Minister removed data, our advice would be for the comments to come from the Minister's Office.

I believe the Health Minister raised this in Estimates in response to LNP Member for Mudgeeraba.
