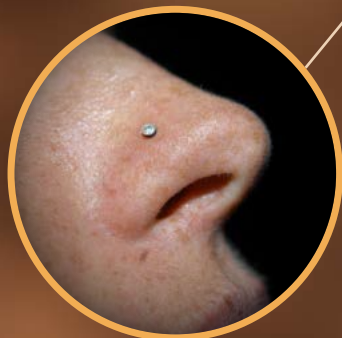

- are aged 40-60 years

- have a backyard tattoo, or home body piercing or scarification

- have liver problems
