Without seeing the epi curve, I'd question whether these are repeated outbreaks. I expect they may well be one continuous outbreak, with perhaps hidden cases in between. What is the longest interval where no cases have presented?

It would also be good to know the other characteristics of the clinical presentations such as incubation period, prevalence and severity of vomiting Vs diarrhoea etc. And any sample testing will hopefully confirm whether this is a new strain etc, to which people have little immunity. I suspect it is, as globally we are due for an epidemic.

All these things influence attack rates, which might explain the high number of cases on a ship where the non-immune population changes frequently, however the response to terminating the outbreak is still the same and requires vigilance in hygiene and cleaning.

I'm not telling anyone anything they don't already know but I guess I'm just hoping that whilst lab samples etc are all very interesting that Sun Princess is on top of the response as much as possible. Despite intense focus in this area, outbreaks can still tend to run their course in a stagnant population so will be even more difficult in a cruise ship with rotating population if they don't get on top of it.



As discussed, several years ago we conducted some environmental swabbing of a ship with a norovirus outbreak. The ship had sent samples via FedEx from Fiji to our Sydney lab so we had 3 of 4 samples positive before arrival. The ship had provided me with the cabin numbers of passengers with reportable AGE. They also sent the public vomit incident log. We then selected all cabins with a positive result and those with multiple ill pax and/or vomit/faecal incidents. To this we added other locations from experience – this included the casino areas and commonly touched surfaces such as telephones, buttons and handrails.

31% of swabs taken were positive. Interestingly 50% of swabs taken in the casino were positive, this included the coin machine and buttons on poker machines and the money trays. Positive areas in cabins included the fabric bed head, a door to the balcony, telephone, sides of a TV and granite bench top surfaces (in a suite). The ship had reported that they had trouble achieving cleaning compliance with the retail shops, because they were sub-contractors. We swabbed the cash registers which were also positive. We got positives in areas that had reportedly been sanitised, which showed the persistence of the virus in the environment. We did not detect provings on handrails, public toilets or in the medical centre, as I think these areas are the main focus of sanitising efforts made by the ship.

Hope this helps.

Perhaps you can let us know what has been done to date.

In our experience this seems to happen from time to time, in general the cruise lines put an enormous effort into decontaminating affected areas/the whole ship, often extending a stay at the home port to bring in extra cleaning crews.

We also facilitate norovirus testing and typing through the local public health lab (SEALS, Prince of Wales Hospital) and typing by Prof Peter White at UNSW. Unlikely to help here.
