## Course 2 | The National Immunisation Program

This online course provides a comprehensive overview of the complex and ever-changing topic of immunisation for those who receipt, administer, or manage vaccines in Queensland.

In this course you will learn about the National Immunisation Program, and the Queensland schedule. You will learn about the routine vaccination of infants, young children, adolescents, and older people. The course also contains information about vaccination for special-risk groups such as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, and those with special vaccination requirements (people who are immunocompromised, pregnant women, preterm infants, and refugees). The course will equip you with the knowledge to plan a catch-up vaccination and use of the National due and overdue rules.
