In Queensland, advanced training in Rheumatology is offered through a state-wide centralised recruitment and selection process coordinated by the **Queensland Rheumatology Advanced Training Network**. Successful applicants will be selected and appointed by a recruitment panel considering training requirements, facility preferences and clinical workforce demands.

RMO application: Step 10 Preferences

To be **considered** for a position on the **Queensland Rheumatology Advanced Training Network**, in the main **'Preferences'** section of the online RMO application you **MUST** complete your first preference as follows:

What is your first preferred facility? *
College/Pathway/Network (Determined) <input type="button" value="v"/>
What is your first preferred position? *
Registrar <input type="button" value="v"/>
What is your first preferred Specialty? *
Medicine <input type="button" value="v"/>
What is your first preferred Sub-Specialty? *
Rheumatology <input type="button" value="v"/>

As up to 5 preferences may be recorded as part of the application, it is recommended that applicants utilise a lower preference to indicate which positions they may be interested in if they are not selected onto the training pathway.
