## Daily influenza cases

Data extracted at 1 September 2023

- 1. The peak influenza season, including influenza B, has ended. However, influenza continues to circulate in the community
- 2. 21,457 people have been diagnosed with influenza since 1 July 2023 across Queensland, including 121 infants under 6 months
- 3. Getting an influenza vaccine in pregnancy is the best protection for infants under 6 months
- 4. Influenza vaccines are well matched to the influenza strains currently circulating in Queensland
- 5. 30% of Queenslanders have been vaccinated against influenza with over 141,000 doses given in Queensland to Queenslanders since 17 July (last update 29 August)

This report includes notifications for Queensland residents diagnosed with influenza in Queensland. Overseas and interstate residents diagnosed in Queensland and individuals with an address not yet assigned to an HHS, are excluded from this report.

'% cases vaccd.' = individuals with a diagnosed influenza episode since 1 July 2023 who had a record of influenza vaccination in 2023 at least 14 days prior to the episode.

Multiple public hospital admissions up to 14 days after an influenza episode are counted once.

Data are current at the time of this report. The total number of notifications may change day to day due to regular data quality activities and because additional cases have been notified to Queensland Health. This is a normal feature of live surveillance data.
