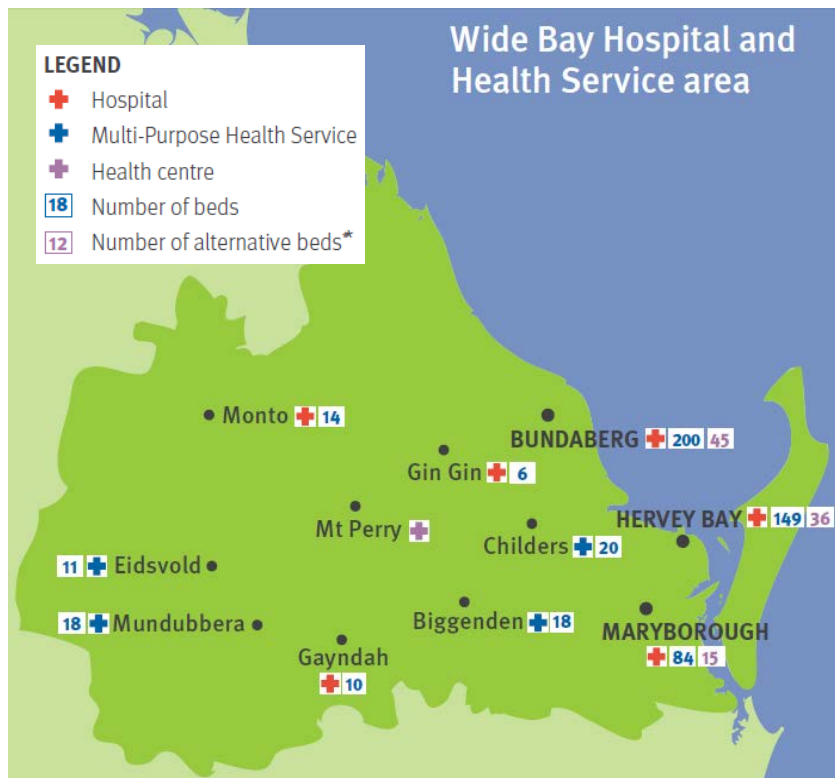

Internship within Bundaberg Hospital



Bundaberg Hospital is a Primary Allocation Centre for Interns within the Wide Bay Hospital and Health Service (WBHHS). There are 10 Queensland Health Intern positions including 5 Rural Generalist Pathway positions, 16 Private Hospital Stream Intern positions and 1 Rural Junior Doctor Training Innovation Fund position at Bundaberg Hospital.

Bundaberg Hospital a 197 bed facility services the North Burnett. The Hospital provides medical staff with broad clinical exposure, hands-on experience and great access to procedural skills. Interns have direct contact with senior clinicians and are actively involved with patient care and have opportunities for clinical research.

Intern education and training opportunities

The Bundaberg Medical Education Unit provides support and assistance with both professional and personal matters with the assistance of the Director of Clinical Training and the Senior Medical Education Officer. An extensive post-graduate education program is offered:

- Weekly junior doctor education sessions
- Fortnightly Grand Rounds
- Intern and junior doctor focused department/unit education program, multidisciplinary team meetings, video conferenced teaching and educational sessions with tertiary facilities.
- SIM based skills and professional development workshops including suturing, plastering, ECG workshops, Basic Life Support, Recognising and Responding to Clinical Deterioration and Program of Experience in the Palliative Approach (PEPA)
- Opportunity to participate in General Clinical Education Committee, Junior Medical Officer forums and the Junior Medical Association



Employment conditions

- Award conditions apply – 76 ordinary working hours per fortnight with a minimum of ten hours off between shifts.
- Two-year contract.
- Individual plans tailored across PGY1, PGY2 & PGY3 if requested to assist transition to training pathways.
- Five weeks annual leave allocated in five-week blocks in line with term rotations.
- No annual leave during the core rotations of Emergency, Medicine and Surgery.
- Interns will be asked to state their preferences for annual leave block and non-core rotations.
- Relocation and travel expenses reimbursement of up to \$5000.
- 4 weeks accommodation provided or up to 4 weeks of rental assistance to the value of \$250 p/week.
