Queensland COVID-19 Vaccination and Influenza Vaccination Training Matrix Version 10 effective 24th May 2022



The Emergency Order – Public Health Emergency – Pandemic Response to Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) – COVID-19 Vaccination Service Providers – COVID-19 Vaccine and Influenza Vaccine, (Emergency Order) specifies requirements for the provision of COVID-19 vaccination services including qualification and training requirements for COVID-19 vaccination centre workers.

All workers for Queensland Government controlled COVID-19 vaccination services must complete the mandatory training requirements relevant to their role detailed in this matrix.

The Declared Provider must keep a register of all training completed by their workers and provide a copy to the chief executive of Queensland Health if requested.

Workers who are NOT operating under the <u>Emergency Order</u> must adhere to their profession specific immunisation training requirements.

Note: Pharmacists who have successfully completed an accredited training program to administer vaccines are not required to complete the QH iLearn – Influenza vaccination training module and may administer influenza vaccines to persons aged 5 years and older, in accordance with the Emergency Order.

Ensure the training matrix is reviewed and completed in full.

Declared providers should confirm COVID-19 vaccination service workers have current knowledge and skill / competency for these requirements. This can be undertaken via self-assessment using the below worker checklist and declaration at the end of this document.

Accessing training

Please read the log in instructions carefully as they vary dependent on your worker function.

Please read the Queensland specific log in instructions below for the Commonwealth modules carefully.

- Vaccination staff who already hold routine immunisation training specific to their profession (e.g. an IPN or pharmacist immuniser) should log into the Australian Government training using the "Immunisation Professional with Ahpra number" log-in category, and select the relevant immunisation training completed from the "Approved Immunisation Program Completed" drop down box.
- Vaccination staff who DO NOT hold routine immunisation training specific to their profession (e.g RNs or other authorised health workers) and all students should log into the Australian Government modules using the "Immunisation Professional without Ahpra number" log in category and select "Other approved immunisation course" from the "Approved Immunisation Program Completed" drop-down box.

Workers authorised to **administer** COVID-19 Vaccine or Influenza Vaccine under the Emergency Order

The following workers are authorised to **administer** (receive, handle, prepare and administer) COVID-19 vaccine, influenza vaccine or related drugs at vaccination centres under the **Emergency Order**. **Completion of the relevant training requirements detailed in this table are mandatory.**
