Rural & Remote Research Capacity Building Program (RRR-Cap)



Health Practitioners in rural and remote areas have access to new opportunities to develop skills in research or translate research into solutions for local challenges

What is RRR-Cap?

The Rural and Remote Research Capacity Building (RRR- Cap) scheme was established through recurrent funding from the Health Practitioners and Dental Officers (HPDO) Certified Agreement (No. 4), 2022. The RRR-Cap is administered by the Office of the Chief Allied Health Officer (OCAHO), Clinical Excellence Queensland. RRR-Cap aims to:

- Establish and maintain research support and mentoring for researchers in rural and remote locations.
- Build research capacity and support evidence-based practice and translation of research into practice in the Health Practitioner workforce in rural and remote health services.

RRR-Cap is available to all Health Practitioner disciplines employed under the HPDO Certified Agreement and working in Category A (rural) and Category B (remote) locations, as defined in HR Policy C42 (https://www.health.qld.gov.au/ data/assets/pdf file/0037/395893/qh-pol-146.pdf).

What does RRR-Cap offer?

RRR-Cap includes a suite of strategies to support research capacity development in rural and remote Health Practitioners. Current opportunities include:

- Graduate Diploma of Research Funding Support EOI offered twice per calendar year
 - o Funding reimbursement to undertake an approve graduate diploma course in research
- Research Dissemination Funding Support EOI submissions encouraged all year; no closing date.
 - Travel reimbursement for conference presentations or fee reimbursement for journal publication (including open access fees).
- Research-focused placements EOI Offered twice per calendar year
 - Travel reimbursement for attending research development placements
- Research Emerging From Routine Activities, Measurement and Evaluation 'REFRAME' Funding EOI offered twice per calendar year
 - Funding support to upgrade a local existing quality improvement (QI), service development or service evaluation project into a formal research project
- Translating Research into Practice (TRIP) Fellowship EOI offered twice per calendar year
 - o Fellowship for clinical backfill for a HP to lead a new or existing TRIP project
