<b>Other Bespoke Specialist Services – Subacute Community Bed Based</b>		
Gold Coast	The Richmond Fellowship of Queensland (RFQ)	Gold Coast Transitional Recovery Service (TRS) and Day Program is an integrated model of service delivered by RFQ (psychosocial supports ) in collaboration with the Gold Coast HHS (clinical supports). The model comprises of two programs of care: Intensive Residential Treatment and Support provided at two properties located in the same street in Robina (providing short term residential support for 7 – 14 days) and Capstone Program providing individual recovery support for up to four weeks following a consumer’s stay at in the Residential program Concurrently the Capstone Program also provides a menu of evidence-based group activities up to 3 months.
Sunshine Coast	Steps Group Australia	Community Subacute Transition and Recovery Service (CSTARS) - a 10-bed subacute transitional recovery service operating 24 hours, seven days a week for up to four weeks. This is an integrated model of service with the Sunshine Coast HHS providing clinical services alongside Steps Group delivering non-clinical psychosocial support services and operational management of the premises.
