The model comprises of two programs of care: Intensive Residential Treatment and Support provided at two properties located in the same street in Robina (providing short term residential support for 7 – 14 days) and Capstone Program providing individual recovery support for up to four weeks following a consumer's stay at in the Residential program Concurrently the Capstone Program also provides a menu of evidence-based group activities up to 3 months.
