<b>Minor and machinery in nature</b>	<p>The <i>Radiation Safety Amendment Regulation 2023</i> amends the <i>Radiation Safety Regulation 2021</i> to omit an offence which has been moved into the <i>Radiation Safety Act 1999</i> and to clarify requirements around disposal of a person's bodily waste where the person has been administered a radionuclide as part of a diagnostic or therapeutic procedure, pursuant to the <i>Health and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023</i>.</p> <p>Queensland Health has assessed the amendments as minor and machinery in nature as they are consequential amendments related to the <i>Health and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023</i>, which was approved by Parliament. Queensland Health has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
