| Minor and machinery in nature | The Radiation Safety Amendment Regulation 2023 amends the Radiation Safety Regulation 2021 to omit an offence which has been moved into the Radiation Safety Act 1999 and to clarify requirements around disposal of a person's bodily waste where the person has been administered a radionuclide as part of a diagnostic or therapeutic procedure, pursuant to the Health and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023. |
| | Queensland Health has assessed the amendments as minor and machinery in nature as they are consequential amendments related to the <i>Health and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023</i> , which was approved by Parliament. Queensland Health has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i> . |
