National Immunisation Program 2024 Influenza Advice (eligibility and vaccines)

It is a mandatory requirement to report all influenza vaccines administered to the Australian Immunisation Register

6 months to less than 5 years

Vaxigrip Tetra[®] OR Fluarix Tetra[®]

• **ALL** children aged 6 months < 5 years

Give 2 doses 4 weeks apart for children aged < 9 years if receiving influenza vaccine for the first time.



5 to 64 years

Vaxigrip Tetra[®] OR Fluarix Tetra[®] OR Flucelvax Quad[®]

- **ALL** Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 5 < 65 years
- ALL individuals with medical conditions associated with an increased risk of influenza disease complications 5 < 65 years
- ALL pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy

Give 2 doses 4 weeks apart for children aged < 9 years if receiving influenza vaccine for the first time.



For NIP influenza vaccine eligible people, vaccination service providers should continue to administer the NIP vaccines received directly from QHIP.

For people not eligible for influenza vaccine under the NIP, vaccination service providers should continue to administer influenza vaccine from their privately purchased stock.
