Corporate Delegations

1. Statement

The Department of Health (the department) Framework for delegating authority ensures the most appropriate individuals can act autonomously to make decisions on behalf of the Minister for Health or Director-General.

2. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to ensure:

- the arrangements by which power, authority and functions are delegated within the department are aligned with legislation and statutory authority in accordance with the legislative requirements set out in the *Financial Accountability Act* 2009, *Public Service Act* 2008 and *Public Sector Ethics Act* 1994
- a consistent and standardised approach to corporate delegations.

3. Scope

This policy applies to all employees, contractors and consultants within the department divisions and commercialised business units.

This policy excludes any clinical related delegations (e.g. Scope of Practice, *Public Health Act 2005* delegations etc.).

4. Principles

The department assigns delegations of authority:

- **In accordance with legislation:** the authorising legislation allows the authority, function or power to be delegated as applicable and/or sub-delegated as applicable.
- **Based on accountabilities and positions:** positions will be individually assessed for the requirements of a delegation.
- **Using a risk based approach:** the levels of delegations align with the department's risk appetite and business needs.
- Within defined business rules: business rules are applied and monitored.
