Part 2 ***The number of people released on the same day, how many of them were detained for 1 day and how many of them detained for more than one day.***

Response: The number of involuntary orders made for one day is tabled below. There were no Treatment Support Orders or Forensic Orders made for one day. The Examination Orders, the data only includes those consumers that did have an assessment (i.e. were not a "failed to attend"), and did not have a treatment authority made as an outcome (as they're already counted in the Treatment Authority data).

For those orders that were more than one day, this information is broadly contained in the Chief Psychiatrist Annual Reports.
