PROGRAM

The PAH GARU is part of the Metro South Health District and is the largest Geriatric and Rehabilitation service in the district. The 76 geriatric beds are complemented by a 16bed psychogeriatric unit and two statewide specialty rehabilitation services (26 bed acquired Brain Injury Unit and a 40 bed Acute Spinal injury unit). Outreach services are provided to ACAT, Redlands Hospital, TCP, and a number of rural sites via telemedicine (Dalby, Kingaroy, Warwick, Roma, Beaudesert). The PAH Geriatric Unit is closely allied with the Centre for Research in Geriatric Medicine (CRGM), University of QLD.

Limited Domiciliary assessments are performed on GP referral to the unit or conjoint visits with the local ACAT. Links with District Dementia Outreach Service provides opportunities for community dementia work.

Coverage Roster: Weekend unit cover 1 in 6 Registrars participate infrequently in the Hospital Med B registrar shifts	Ward responsibilities/workload: Responsible for 26 bed geriatric ward or 16 bed psychogeriatric ward (shared with a psychiatry registrar). The Community and Research registrars both have a telemedicine caseload. Orthogeriatrician supervises the research/ orthogeriatric registrar for NOFs and orthopaedic patients over 75
Consultations: Consults are fielded by registrars on a roster by day of week with follow-up consultant rounds held 3 times a week	Specialist Clinic coverage: Specialty clinics are routinely attended depending on unit rotation
Domiciliary assessments / ACAT assessments: Done on request. Registrars are able to attend residential care visits supervised by Dr Varghese ACAT assessments for the PAH are undertaken by the Geriatric Unit Community Registrar position with RACF, Domicillary, TCP and ACAT attendance	Research/presentations: Close working relationship with academic unit (CRGM) permits support for trainee projects and assistance with study design and statistical methods.

Teaching responsibilities:

Registrars teach medical students from years 1 through to 4 with 4th year and overseas students attending the unit as an elective term. 3rd year students attend the unit for an 8 week term as part of the medicine in society program.

Rotations available and opportunities for flexible training:

Opportunities exist for rotations in specialty rehab (spinal and Brain Injury).
