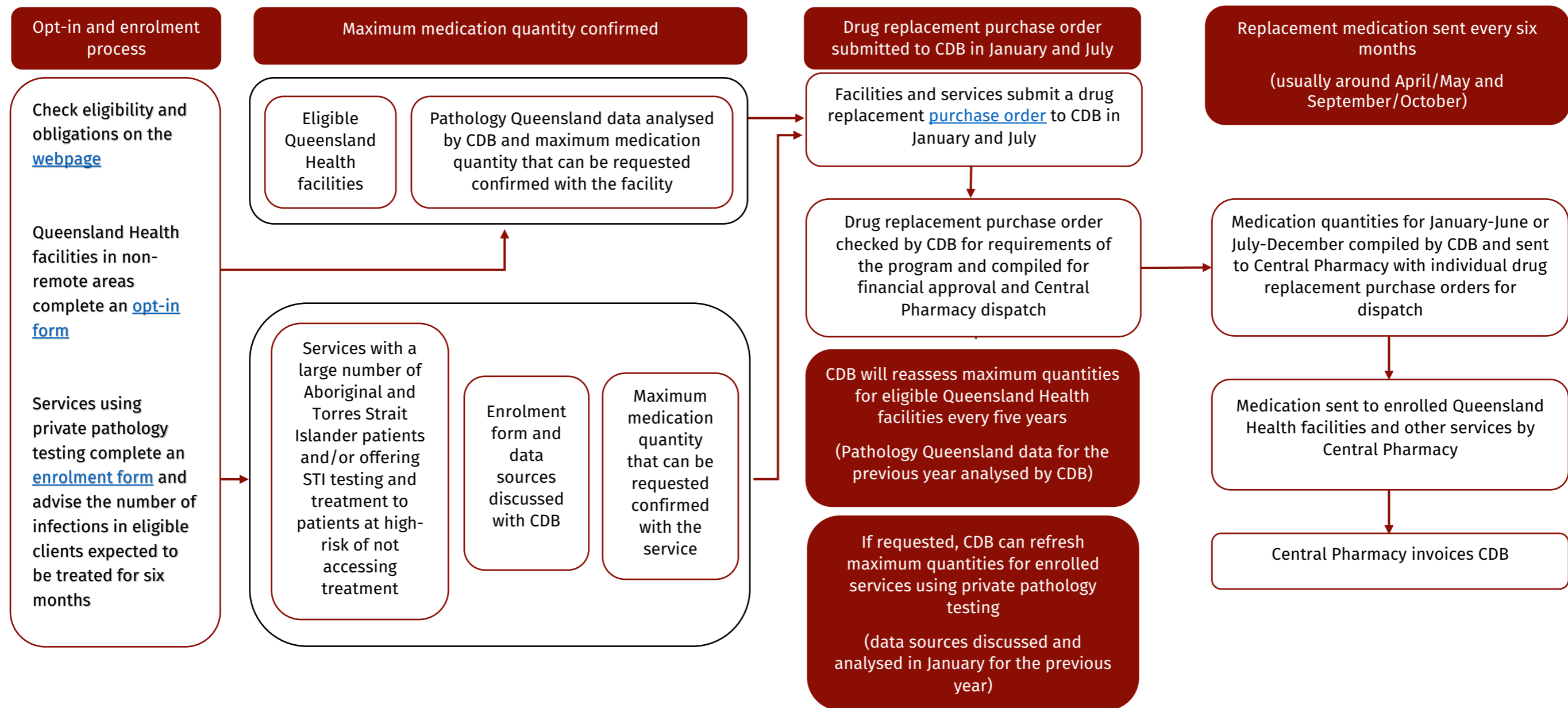


Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander STI drug replacement program

Enrolment & Data Flow

How it works: complete the opt-in or enrolment form, receive advice about maximum medication quantity approved for your service, submit a drug replacement purchase order to Communicable Diseases Branch (CDB) in January and July, receive replacement medication from Central Pharmacy.¹



¹ The medication is free for participating services and Central Pharmacy invoices are paid by CDB. Due to transportation costs and expiry date issues, the total number of positive tests/diagnoses of chlamydia, gonorrhoea and trichomoniasis must be a minimum of five for the six-month period. Where there is less than five, a replacement will not be processed.

For samples processed by Pathology Queensland the program relies on completion of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander identification question on the pathology request form.
