#### **Queensland Health Data Dictionary (QHDD)**

- Queensland Health Information Knowledgebase (QHIK) is an electronic repository for storing, managing and disseminating Queensland Health's metadata.
- The QHDD is available in QHIK and is owned and managed by the Statistical Services Branch (SSB).
- A filtered copy of the QHIK can be accessed by the public on the <u>Queensland Health</u> internet page.
- The following metadata item types are included in the QHDD:
  - Data elements
  - Information assets (data collections, data repositories and other)
  - Data supply requirements (HHS Service Agreement, Queensland Legislation and other).

#### QHDD data elements (data items)

- With the next software release, the description of individual data elements will be compliant with the international standard for Standardization/International Electrotechnical Commission (ISO/IEC) Standard 11179 (first edition) "Specification and standardization of Data Elements" (ISO/IEC 11179-1:2023(E) Information technology -Metadata registries (MDR) – Part 1: Framework.)
