End of Life Law for Clinicians (ELLC) is a free training program for clinicians, medical students and allied health professionals about the law relating to end of life decision-making. Improving your knowledge of end of life law can enhance your capacity to manage legal issues in end of life decision-making, leading to improved quality of care and practice.

This interactive workshop will focus on the law on end of life decision-making for children in the context of a clinical case study. Topics covered may include consent to treatment for non-competent children, end of life decision-making by competent children, withholding and withdrawing treatment, futile or non-beneficial treatment, emergency treatment, and managing disputes.
