## Database of Research Activity

The Database of Research Activity (DoRA) is a publicly accessible, searchable website covering all Queensland Health human research, not just clinical trials.

### How will DoRA benefit me as a researcher?

It is an open advertisement detailing your study and may help recruit more participants

It may be used by industry and other researchers to find potential collaborators for future studies

It may be used by researchers to help refine their own work so as to not repeat unnecessarily something that has already been done many times over

It may be used by researchers to help formulate ideas on where there are gaps in the research for a particular therapeutic area

### How will DoRA benefit me as a health care provider?

It will keep you up to date on the latest research being conducted in Queensland Health

It will help you to refer patients to an appropriate study if they are interested in participating

It may help you formulate collaborations between health care providers thereby encouraging information sharing
