Free workshops for parents about children with day and night wetting

Are you **wondering** about your child's **wees**? Help is at hand!

Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Service (SCHHS) is holding a free, three-hour **'Wondering about Wees'** workshop at Mountain Creek on 14 March.

This session is for parents or carers of children aged five years and over with bedwetting and day time bladder issues including frequency, urgency, withholding and wetting.

Occupational Therapist, Di Collis said: "The workshop lets parents know what is normal, when they should be concerned, why the problems happen and what to do.

"Advice includes using diaries to find underlying causes and treatment options including wetting alarms, medications, habit/lifestyle changes and ways to improve children's motivation," she said.

"Follow up one-on-one support options are discussed. The workshops are also about bringing groups of parents together so they do not feel they are alone."

Ms Collis said bedwetting was a common problem occurring in 10 per cent of seven-year-olds children and day wetting affects five to 12 per cent of seven-year-olds.

"Not all children automatically out-grow these conditions and we know children's self-esteem and confidence is affected. They feel embarrassed and ashamed. Parents often experience frustration, confusion and this can negatively affect their relationship with their child," she said.

The next Wondering about Wees workshop is on Wednesday, 14 March from 9:30am to 12:30pm at Mountain Creek State School on Lady Musgrave Drive.
