## Summary of Changes

Please be advised that the following changes will be implemented in the Queensland Perinatal Data Collection for the 2020-2021 collection period to meet Department of Health, state and national reporting requirements.

Addition of new Maternity Model of Care items below:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Female-primary maternity model of care, identifier</li> <li>• Female-maternity model of care at the onset of labour or non-labour caesarean section, identifier</li> </ul> <p>The Maternity Care Classification System (MaCCS) was developed as part of the National Maternity Data Development Project (NMDDP) to enable service-level reporting of maternity models of care (MoC) in each jurisdiction and nationally. The collection of the MoC data at the service level allows for inclusion of two agreed data items into the Perinatal National Minimum Data Set (NMDS). These data items will record the MoC that a woman experienced throughout her pregnancy using data from the MoC National Best Practice Data Set (NBPDS).</p> <p>The scope of the data set is all models of maternity care available to pregnant and birthing women. The MaCCS, utilising the NBPDS provides a standardised nomenclature and descriptive data for maternity models of care. State and national collation of these data enables meaningful analysis and comparisons of maternal and perinatal outcomes between differing models of care. The data elements in the NBPDS describe the different characteristics of models of maternity care based on three domains:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The women a model is designed for;</li> <li>• The carers working in the model; and</li> <li>• Aspects of how care is provided.</li> </ul> <p>The AIHW will contact maternity services and ask them to update MoC using the MaCCS DCT so data is updated for 1 January 2020 to allow for six months evaluation prior to reporting commencement from 1 July 2020.</p> <p>The new Models of Care items are to be used for births occurring from 1 July 2020.</p>	<p>45</p>
