Major construction projects

Gold Coast Health has several exciting major construction projects in the pipeline, designed to meet the health needs of our growing community.

Secure Mental Health Rehabilitation Unit

Construction is commencing soon on a new 40-bed Secure Mental Health Rehabilitation Unit at GCUH.

Tugun Satellite Hospital

Construction is underway on the new Tugun Satellite Hospital which is part of the State Government's Satellite Hospitals Program. The building will include community health, day therapy services such as renal dialysis, complex wound management, outpatients and a minor injury and illnesses centre.

70 extra beds for Gold Coast University Hospital

Planning is underway for an expansion that will provide 70 extra sub-acute beds at Gold Coast University Hospital. A new multi-level building will provide beds for Geriatric Evaluation and Management, a Memory Support Unit and a Complex Management Unit.

More public beds for Robina patients

Gold Coast Health is making progress towards a leasing arrangement with Robina Private Hospital to create about 116 beds and six theatres/recovery in the planned expansion of the private hospital.
