

Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC) validation updates

January 2020

The QHAPDC validation updates for January 2020 are:

H849 Code x with assigned Condition onset flag and current length of stay is outside the range of clinical advice. (Warning). The below HAC gastrointestinal diagnosis codes will trigger this validation if they are assigned with a Condition onset flag (COF) = 2 Condition arose during the episode of care AND the episode of care length of stay is less than 14 days. The diagnosis codes are:

- A04.7 *Enterocolitis due to Clostridium difficile*
- A08.1 *Acute gastroenteropathy due to Norovirus*
- A08.4 *Viral intestinal infection, unspecified.*



H890 Other diagnosis code x should have a Condition onset flag of 2 Condition arose during the episode of care (Fatal) includes changes for diagnosis code P03.x *Fetus and newborn affected by other complications of labour and delivery*. Newborns in the birth episode of care that have a P03.x code assigned must have a COF = 2 Condition arose during the episode of care. If P03.x code is assigned in a non-birth episode of care, they must have a COF = 1 Condition present on admission to the episode of care.



H911 Pharmacotherapy assigned for multi day stay (Fatal) relates to ACHI code 96199-19 [1920] *Intravenous administration of pharmacological agent, other and unspecified pharmacological agent*. As per ACS 0042 *Procedures normally not coded*, procedure codes for pharmacotherapy are not assigned unless they are the principal reason for admission in same-day episodes of care or another specialty standard directs they should be assigned, such as ACS 1615 *Specific diseases and interventions related to the sick neonate*.
