<b>Minor and machinery in nature</b>	<p>The <i>Health and Other Legislation Amendment (Postponement) Regulation 2023</i> postpones the commencement of part 5, division 3 of the <i>Health and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023</i> (Amendment Act) until the end of 2 May 2025, pursuant to section 15DA of the <i>Acts Interpretation Act 1954</i>.</p> <p>Part 5, division 3 of the Amendment Act amends the <i>Public Health Act 2005</i> to modernise the Queensland Cancer Register by expanding notification requirements.</p> <p>A delayed commencement is required for these provisions to ensure that the relevant implementation activities, including installation of technology for radiology practices, stakeholder education, updating approved forms and providing resources for the public online and at health sites, can first be completed.</p> <p>Queensland Health has assessed the amendments as machinery in nature given the amendments only have the effect of delaying the commencement of provisions. Delaying commencement does not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy or create new impacts on business, government or the community. Queensland Health has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
