# RTI #3638 - Babies discharged and readmitted within 28 days

# **Contextual Information**

There is no Statewide clinical guideline that states a baby is to be discharged at a certain length of stay.

The Statewide Routine Newborn Assessment Queensland Clinical Guideline identifies that "every newborn requires a brief physical examination within the first few minutes after borth and then a full and detailed assessment within the next 48 hours and prior to discharge from hospital."

Clear guidance is provided to evaluate each mother- newborn dyad individually and involve the family when determining optimal time of discharge. Criteria for newborn discharge include physiologic stability, family preparedness to provide newborn care, availability of social support, and access to the health care system and resources.

## **Data source**

The attached information has been extracted from the Queensland Hospital Admitted Patient Data Collection (QHAPDC), and prepared by the Statistical Reporting and Coordination Unit, Services Branch, Department of Health



- 4. The rate of readmission within 28 days for babies discharged within 0-24 hours was 2.0%, 95 per cent confidence intervals = 1.44%, 2.62%.
- 5. The rate of readmission within 28 days for babies discharged >24 hours was 2.4%, 95 per cent confidence intervals = 2.13%, 2.70%.
- 6. The difference between readmission rates for discharges within 0-24 hours and > 24 hours is not statistically significant.
