POSITIVE

You've been exposed to hepatitis C in your life. Another blood test is required.

> PCR BLOOD TEST Checks if the virus is in your blood.

ANTIBODY BLOOD TEST

Checks if you have been exposed to hepatitis C.

NEGATIVE

You've never been exposed to hepatitis C.



POSITIVE

Hepatitis C is present in your blood. You may require further tests.

- PCR genotype test
- Liver function test
- Fibroscan
- PCR viral load
- Fibrosis marker
