
- Health Services Information Agency (HSIA) engaged a senior business analysis contractor resource for a six month period from 1 April 2015 until 30 September 2015 to support the enterprise applications and infrastructure configuration of the SCPUH program.
- 2. The resource is critical and if not extended, the current arrangement will expire on 30 September 2015 and significantly hinder the projects ability to deliver integrated and effective business solutions.
- 3. The current contractor has previous experience is large new hospitals projects providing expert analysis and understanding of business requirements, co-ordinating the associated changes to both enterprise applications and underpinning infrastructure to commission the ICT environments suitable for this digital hospital.

SUBJECT: Engagement of a consultant to perform independent assessment of Pathology Queensland (PQ) services

#### Recommendations

1. It is recommended that the Director-General approve the engagement of a consultant, at a cost of up-to \$50,000 (including GST), to deliver: a) an independent assessment of PQ's Public Sector Comparator (PSC) for the Sunshine Coast Public University Hospital (SCPUH), and b) a benchmark for pathology laboratory requirements at SCPUH, including recommendations on achieving cost savings of up-to 38% over the next three years.

#### Issues

- 1. In recent discussions between Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Service (SCHHS), and the PQ SCPUH Laboratory Implementation Project, SCHHS requested that:
  - 1.1. PQ investigate refinement of their service costs; and
  - 1.2. develop a plan to aghieve savings of up-to 38% over the next three years.
- 2. Following success of PQ's PSC submission for the SCPUH pathology service, the Health Support Queensland (MSQ) Advisory Board requested information on the learnings of the evaluation of the PSC for consideration.
- 3. Approval is now sought for the engagement of a subject matter expert consultant, to facilitate this work.
- 4. The consultant will provide two key outcomes as part of this work:
  - 4.1. an independent assessment of PQ's PSC submission for the SCPUH pathology service.
  - 4.2. a benchmark for pathology laboratory requirements at SCPUH, including recommendations on achieving cost savings of up to 38% over the next three years.
- 5. Consultant services will be required for approximately 30 days, and will necessitate a subject matter expert in the field of pathology services.
- 6. Upon approval of this brief, appropriate financial and procurement delegations will be exercised.

#### **Results of Consultation**

1. Malcolm Stringer, General Manager, Laboratory Operations, PQ agrees with this approach.

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## Resource Implications (including Financial)

- 2. This engagement will be funded from the existing allocation within the Chief Operating Officer, HSQ's budget.
- 3. The overall cost of the services is estimated to be up-to \$50,000 (including GST).

## Background

- 4. A consulting firm ( ) was engaged by the SCHHS to provide commercial and financial advisory services for the SCPUH clinical support services PSC project.
- 5. The PSC Project released a Request for Binding Bid (RFBB), and PQ was requested by the SCHHS and \_\_\_\_\_ to submit a PSC to be assessed against the RFBB responses.

6. PQ submitted their PSC in November 2014.

7. A final decision on the provision of pathology services at SCPUH was announced by the Minister for Health in June 2015.
